# **CONCEPT NOTE**

The **Tropical Agriculture Platform** (TAP) is a G20 initiative, officially launched in 2012, with a mandate to work towards bridging the capacity gap for agricultural innovation in the tropics. Its objective is to increase the coherence and effectiveness of capacity development interventions for agricultural innovation systems, so they can lead to sustainable change and impact at scale.

Since its launch, TAP and its 52 Partners have embraced the Agricultural Innovation Systems (AIS) perspective, acting as a multilateral dynamic facilitation mechanism that enables better coherence and greater impact of Capacity development interventions in AIS. TAP major achievements include the development and piloting of a **Common Framework on Capacity Development for AIS (2015-2019)**, as well as practical tools and capacity development manuals, the integration of the TAP concept and approaches in to Strategic Plans, programmes and projects of the Partners, and development of **TAPipedia**, a global knowledge platform on CD for AIS.

TAP partners are contributing to the promotion of the TAP Common Framework and implementation of TAP Action Plan through various initiatives and programmes. Such contributions are periodically disseminated and shared with all partners through regular TAP Newsletters. In 2020, TAP partners were re-engaged in the Capacity Development Expert Group (CDEG) and members of this group participated in an e-discussion on the review of the Common Framework (CF) documents which are currently being revised in light of the lessons and experiences from its applications. In 2021, the TAP Secretariat launched a "Learning Review" of the TAP partnership in order to assess the main achievements of the TAP Partnership, with regard to the changes in organizations as effect of the different

products of TAP. In addition, a working group of TAP Partners is advancing on the development of the TAP Engagement and Expansion Strategy, while a first draft of the new TAP Action Plan (2022-2025) has been developed.

In this context, the eighth TAP Partners Assembly will be a key event to bring TAP Partners together to discuss the progress of implementation of the current TAP Action Plan, to discuss the future one and to improve coordination and collaboration among the partners.

Specifically, the objectives of this event are:

- 1. To discuss the current status of implementation of the TAP Action Plan (2018-2021)
- 2.To present the draft new TAP Action Plan 2022-2025 and gather further inputs from TAP partners for endorsement before end of 2021.
- 3. To get an update on the revision of the Common Framework and e-learning module
- 4. To share the preliminary findings of the TAP Learning Review
- 5. To present the draft Engagement Strategy
- 6. To get familiar and updated on the Partners ongoing programmes and projects (side events).

The seventh TAP Partners Assembly will be organized virtually and will comprise:

- Two virtual meetings/sessions (via zoom) of 2.5 hours each.
- Side-events on specific topics to be organized by TAP Partners upon their proposals (details to be shared).
